The case for depth by Craig Stanfield

A short and sweet article this issue. Have you ever thought the value of a depth sounder, preferably one with a depth alert?

Yours truly took his Smallest Commander on the LBJ Rendezvous to see if the bugs were worked out. On day zero (of a 6 day event) - the arrival day, I found granite. 32 inches of draft in a sub 32 inch world. Prop, strut, shaft, various mechanical bitts related to the grounding. All caused at a dead idle.

I am currently on the lookout for a classy but simple (and CHEAP) digital depth sounder with an **audible warning**. **Any recommendations....send** them my way.
