These are some of the photos of my vinyl deck replacement. I used either Monel or SS staples and was working on my second thousand when it was completed. I fitted the old vinyl over the new decking and matched up the existing holes in the vinyl with the holes in the underlying wood to replace the deck hardware. Some judicious poking around with pins located the previous holes.

Nice match and it looked very similar to what I started with. I filled the previous screw holes with toothpicks and contact cement to tighten up things a bit. Since the decks are composed of plywood, I generously dobbed the cut edges and existing holes with Git Rot to preclude any water seeping into the wood. Another handy thing was to replace the nuts with wing nuts and lock washers where machine screws held down the hardware - which should make replacement even easier next time. With the wiring, rather than hand splicing the cut ends I replaced them with male and female connectors to make removal even easier the next time around.

At this year's Keels and Wheels, Heidi van Horne wandered by later in the day. Her brilliant blue dress was just too much a match to my deck vinyl for me to let her tet by. She gracefully agreed to provide some "eye candy" for my new decks!

CAPTAIN (RETO) JEFF HILL

CORDINATOR

Jeff was born in Toronto, Ontario in 1961 and developed an interest in flying at a young age. At 17, he earned a private pilot flying scholarship with the Royal Canadian Air Cadets and was subsequently accepted into the Aviation and Flight Technology Program at Toronto's Seneca College in 1980. He graduated with honours in 1983, having earned a commercial pilot's license as well as multi-engine instrument and instructor ratings.



In the fail of 1983, Jeff joined the Canadian Forces and received his wings in 1986 at CFB Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan following jet training on the CT-114 Tutor. His first posting took him to Comox, British Columbia where he flew the CP-140 Aurora anti-submarine patrol aircraft with 407 Maritime Patrol Squadron. Rising to the position of Maritime Patrol Crew Commander, he was one of the last group of crew members to log time tracking nuclear submarines from the former Soviet Union before that country's collapse.

In the spring of 1989, Jeff was selected by the Canadian Forces Snowbirds aerobatic team as Team Coordinator/Narrator for the 1990-1991 airshow seasons. At the end of his Snowbird tour, Jeff left the military and joined American Airlines where he has flown the Boeing 727, Fokker 100 and McDonnell Douglas Super 80 aircraft out of Dallas/Fort Worth, Texas.

Jeff's hobbies include working part-time for Goodfriend Aircraft, inc. where he helps restore antique and classic aircraft. Recent projects have included a WW II Boeing Stearman, a 1931 Waco RBA, a 1948 Bucker Jungmann and a 1947 Piper J3 Cub.
